It is a time to look ahead to the new school year that is about to begin, and to re-focus our energies on the task of providing the best, most inspiring and empowering Catholic education possible for our young people—and that is a task that takes the combined efforts of every single one of us! As we come back from the summer, and begin to make the transition back to work, it is a particularly appropriate time to ask God's blessing on us and our work, to guide us throughout the months ahead, with all of the joys and challenges that they will inevitably hold.

STUDENT ACTIVITY FEE

Thank you to those families who have already paid their Student Activity Fees for the 2019/2020 school year. Payment of this fee helps support religious retreats, field trips, sports teams, guest speakers, dances/prom, student clubs, learning commons furniture, and provides your son/daughter with a student card. The fee is \$35.00. Please ensure your son/daughter's activity fee is paid as soon as possible on our online payment system, School-Day. We do encourage all families to pay this fee, should you require help to set up or log in to School-Day, please visit the main office for assistance. Last years monies went to Chromebook purchases / Projector replacements / Field Trip bussing / Retreats / Student Council.

SCHOOL DAY - CASHLESS SCHOOL

The Simcoe Muskoka Catholic District School Board understands that it can be difficult for parents to stay on top of all the activities that happen at school. That is why we are implementing a new online payment and communications tool in our schools. This tool, called "School-Day", is currently available at DOM.

Benefits for parents?

School-Day can be accessed from any web browser and gives parents real-time, secure access to up-to-date information, and the ability to:

- Receive email communications from your child's school
- Approve permission forms on-line
- Register your child for extracurricular events
- Make online payments for yearbooks, student cards, sports fees, trips or other activities
- Update your mobile device with calendar events specific to your child
- Minimize the risks associated with sending money to school with your child ("backpack delivery") and reduce the environmental impact of photocopying permission forms and announcement



STUDENT MEDICATION/ALLERGIES

If your son or daughter takes medication, we are required to keep this information in the office. Medication forms are available in the office, which must be signed by a parent in order for any medication to be administered or consumed during the school day. If your child has a life-threatening condition, such as a bee or food allergies or diabetes, asthma, etc., kindly contact the office so that an Individual Plan of Care can be established.

The Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit website www.simcoemuskokahealth.org has a wealth of health related information available, this is a link to a list of mandatory immunizations for students to enter/stay in school for your reference.

STUDENT ABSENCES

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact the school at 705-646-8772 (extension 301) or provide a note when your son/daughter returns by 8:45 am. Unverified absences will be considered truant. Kindly call and notify about your child's absence prior to 11:30 on the day of their absence. Notification after 11:30 may result in a call home notifying you of their absence. All student attendance records will be updated within 24 hours of your call. If you wish to sign your son or daughter in or out during the day, please do so in the main office.

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT-Handbook

Parents, please review the CODE OF CONDUCT with you child that can be found on our website, under the FOR STUDENTS tab. We do ask Parents to check in at the main office when visiting the school during the day. Our office administration will assist you from the main office. Please do not text/phone your children while they are in class. Should an emergency occur, please call the school, so that we can properly support your child. We do our best to answer the phones.

STUDENT PARKING

If a student drives a vehicle to school, they are required to register their vehicle at the main office. Each vehicle must visibly display a St. Dominic Parking Pass on their dash. There is no charge for a Parking Permit



Students are ONLY permitted to use their cell phones in the cafeteria and halls outside of class time, (before school, between periods, after school). Students are not permitted to use their cell phones during class time, unless directed by the teacher. If parents need to contact students please do so by calling the front office. We ask parents not to text their child during classes. Sometimes students will need to be reminded of our policy:

First Offence: The phone is confiscated and kept in the office for the remainder of the day and will be returned to the student at the end of the school day.

Second Offence (Plus): Phone is confiscated and kept in the office for remainder of the day however a PARENT will need to pick the phone up from the school. It is important to note that the SMCDSB policy states: PEDs (PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES) - under the direction of the Principal, the use of personal electronic devices, such as cell phones, video recorders or other technologies is restricted while on school property. Any PEDs brought to school have the potential for loss, damage or theft. The school will not be responsible for loss, damage or theft of these devices. PEDs may be used at appropriate times at the discretion of the classroom teacher. No PED is to be present during assessment/evaluation activities. Failure to comply may result in confiscation of the PED, to be returned to student/parent at the discretion of school administration.

BYOD - Bring Your Own Device

St. Dominic continues to outfit our students with Technology (Chromebooks, other devices) for their educational use. Students can also bring in their laptops and other devices to help access the internet and submit assessments. This policy, as it pertains to cell phones, will be compliant with the information listed above and under the direction of the teacher, using it as an educational tool. St. Dominic Catholic S.S. will not be responsible for any theft or loss of personal items as it pertains to BYOD.

GRADE 10 - ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST (OSSLT)



This year the OSSLT is Tuesday March 31st, 2020. This provincially mandated test will be given to all the Grade 10 students and to any student who did not write it in the past. **This very important test is a diploma requirement.** Please ensure that any appointments and vacations are not scheduled on these dates.

GRADE 9 - EQAO MATH RESULTS

The results of last year's Grade 9 EQAO Mathematics Assessment are in, and St. Dominic students have continued their run of excellence! In the Applied level, 67% of St. Dominic students met the provincial standard, compared to the provincial average of 44% and the Simcoe Muskoka CDSB average of 40%. At the Academic level, 90% of our students met the provincial standard, versus the provincial average of 84% and the board average of 77%. Congratulations to all last year's grade 9 students for the best results in our entire school board--your hard work and dedication paid off! Kudos also to Mrs. Doyle and Mrs. Rogers, who guided our students to success. Best wishes to this year's grade nines, who will write the EQAO exams in June.

<u>COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS-</u> GRADE 9's – Did you know that you can start collecting your hours as of July 1 - 2019? Students are reminded to complete their 40 hours of community service as it is a Secondary School Diploma requirement. A good rule of thumb is to complete 10 hours for each year of high school. Remember to keep track of hours on the Community Service Tracking Sheet located in the Guidance office (and online via our website) and submit these forms as hours are completed.

EXAMINATIONS

EXAMS AND OTHER SUMMATIVE EVALUATIONS

1st Semester Final Exams are January 23-January 29th, 2020. These dates include In-Class Exams as well. Full attendance during exams is essential to your child's success. The week prior to exams many classes have additional in-class exam components, in which attendance is also mandatory. The last 3 weeks of most courses is designated to completing Course Culminating Tasks (CCT's). The summative mark in each course, consisting of the CCT assignment and final exams constitute 30% of your child's mark in each course. It is imperative that your child be in full attendance during these assessment dates times.

Dates for both additional in-class exam components (for Gr. 9 students this includes the Math EQAO) and final exams will not be rescheduled. Please do not book vacations, plan to attend tournaments, have job commitments, etc. during this time. A mark of zero may be assigned if your child does not attend on the date of their scheduled exam or additional in-class exam component. Should a major medical illness arise please contact the main office. A Doctor's note indicating the medical emergency and the impossibility to complete the exam on the scheduled date may be requested, or a mark of zero will be assigned. In most cases CCT dates in the last 3 weeks of the course will not be rescheduled. Please ensure that you are contacting both the teacher and the Main Office prior to absences during this time.

Your child's success is our priority, and we want to ensure your child has every opportunity to be successful not only throughout the semester, but also during the essential summative evaluations in the final weeks of each semester. Thank you for your cooperation.
